At the 3-way stop, turn left and take  
the first driveway on the left to enter.

Buckeye Lake Village is known as a lake community. But if you travel away from the shoreline just a quarter of a mile inland, you will discover the beautiful Ryan Braden Park and the Village Recreation Center.

Among the Park offerings is a Baseball Field where you can take in a junior league ball game most weekends during the summer. For the really young there is a Playground with swings, climbing equipment, and many other structures. For the older youth there is a Skate Park where you will find youth riding their bikes and skate boards up and down the ramps most days. For those a little older, the Park has two Pickleball/Basketball Courts which are open to teams and individual players free of charge. There's a Shelter House with a gas grill and picnic tables. Horseshoe Pits round out the fun equipment available for visitors.



The recently acquired Recreation Center (formerly the Youth Center) has been renovated inside and out. It is handicap accessible, has a 35'x35' great room with tables and chairs, large kitchen with eating/preparation area, a refrigerator and sink with running water, and two restrooms. It can accommodate up to 70 people and seat 60. An overhead door can be raised that opens onto a beautiful lawn for added space.

If Ryan Braden Park and the Recreation Center don't float your boat, there's also the Pavilion Park. The Amish-built timber frame Pavilion constructed completely with wooden pins signed by residents and Buckeye Lake Village leaders is a beautiful piece of architecture available for rent. Situated near the Village water tower (painted to appear as a lighthouse), it is a perfect pastoral setting for family reunions, graduation parties, and other events.
